In the Developmental Medicine Center at Boston Children's Hospital, we use TriVox Health (formerly known as ICISS Health) for your child's care with Developmental Medicine Center providers.

What is TriVox Health and how does it work?

TriVox Health is an online tool that lets you send important information about your child's symptoms and functioning to your child's provider. This helps the provider take better care of your child. Families find it easy to use. Here's how it works:

1. After you are enrolled, you will receive an email from *TriVox Health* to set up your unique account. When you click on the link, you will be sent to a secure website where you'll create a password and activate your account.
2. Periodically, *TriVox Health* will send you an email with a link to the same secure website. After logging in, you will be guided through questionnaires about your child's symptoms and functioning.

What are the questionnaires and who is asked to share information about my child?

Questionnaires are designed to monitor specific conditions, such as ADHD or autism. Your child's provider requests questionnaires to be sent on a schedule appropriate for your child's care. This can be before every visit, monthly, or even weekly depending on your child's needs. We ask caregivers to fill out the questionnaires, as well as your child if he or she is able and old enough, and your child's teachers if applicable. Each September, TriVox Health will ask you to update teacher contact information. You may also receive information about research studies that you could participate in.

Who can see information about my child?

Members of your clinical care team in Developmental Medicine and Boston Children's Hospital will have access to this information. This information will not be shared with anyone else without your explicit permission, even if they are contributing information to TriVox Health (e.g. teachers). TriVox Health encrypts and protects the information you send through the TriVox Health website with the same technology used to protect online banking information.

When will my provider see my child's information?

Your child's provider will choose when to review the information. This might not be until the day of your visit. **If there is anything you want your child's provider to know right away, you must call the clinic: 617-355-7025. If your child needs to be seen by a provider immediately, call 911 or go to your nearest emergency room.**

Who do I ask for help?

If you have a question about the care of your child, call your provider immediately.

How do I start? How do I stop?

TriVox Health will send you an email so that you can activate your account and fill out questionnaires. If you decide you no longer want to use the system, you can click "unsubscribe" on any of the TriVox Health email notifications.





How TriVox Health Looks and Works

First, you will receive an email from TriVox Health that looks like this.

(Usually two weeks before your child's next visit, but sometimes more frequently depending on your child's needs.) Please note that we are in the process of transitioning from our old name (ICISS Health) to our new name, so you will still see "ICISS Health" for a little while longer.



When you click on the secure link highlighted above, you come to the Welcome Page, which looks like this.




For Teachers: How TriVox Health Looks and Works


